POST-OP INSTRUCTION FOR MASTOPEXY WITH IMPLANTS

1. Take all medication as prescribed. Finish the whole prescription of antibiotics. You may discontinue your pain medication as tolerated and switch to Ibuprofen or Tylenol.
2. Always wash your hands with antibacterial soap before changing your dressing so or touching your incisions.
3. You will be sent home from surgery in a surgical bra. This bra is to be worn at all times.
4. You may shower the day after surgery. DO NOT take a bath. You may remove bra to shower. Removal all bandages. DO NOT remove steri-strips (tape on the incisions). You may use antibacterial soap and let water run over breasts, but do not let water beat directly on incisions. Pat dry. Apply clean bandage (maxi pads may be used) and surgical bra.
5. Bruising and swelling is expected and normal. This may last for 2-4 weeks.
6. Activity should be limited. No straining or lifting greater than a milk carton. You should be up walking as tolerated.
7. You may alternate your pain medication and your muscle relaxer in order to have continued pain relief. If taking them at the same time helps with the pain better that is also fine. Make sure to keep pain managed, do not let it get severe before medicating.
8. We will teach you about care and massage of the implant at your first post-op clinic appointment. DO NOT massage before you are instructed to.
9. Watch for signs of a hematoma. These signs include sudden swelling of one or both breasts, (usually double in size, throbbing) excessive sudden bruising. If in doubt call the office.
10. Notify you doctor if a temperature of greater than 101 degrees develops and lasts longer than 24 hours or if there are any signs of infection (redness at incision site, warmth, tender or hard, foul smelling drainage from incision) or hematoma (sudden swelling of one breast significantly larger than the other and coal black bruising). 11. If you cannot reach your physician and immediate attention is needed please go to your nearest emergency room.
